

Content

The one-day-workshop Grant Writing covers the basics of grant writing. Writing a successful grant proposal requires basic knowhow, content knowledge, writing proficiency, strong research skills, creativity, organizational ability, patience, and a great deal of luck. This course provides students with the background and skills necessary to develop a competitive funding proposal. PhD students and Postdocs learn how to write a grant proposal start to finish.

Specific Topics

- Techniques for finding an idea for a research proposal
- Strategies for developing a proposal
- Basic components of a grant proposal package
- Discussion of pros and cons of a sample abstract
- Writing your own abstract
- Presentation and discussion of own written abstracts

Aim

The workshop instructs participants on the principles of successful grant applications. Students are asked to put new knowledge into practice, therefore retain what they have learned.

Target Group

PhD Students and Postdocs planning to apply for a research grant.

Methodology

The workshop combines presentation, discussion, and practical, hands-on exercises. Copies of research proposal checklist, writing guideline, list of useful phrases, and various sample abstracts will be provided.
